- Action Steps/ Goals
 - 49 Pathways
 - Ensure all students are workforce & post-secondary ready by implementing individual pathways for students
 - All VR students will complete their quality indicators during the 17-18 school year
 - Capstone Committee
 - Pilot capstone project through Concurrent Enrollment to show Pathways Mastery
 - Expand relationships and articulate pathways with post-secondary educational programs and area industries
 - Improving Quality Instruction: Increasing student achievement data collection and analysis using PSAT/ SAT in order to create a better cycle of curricular development, instruction, assessment and accountability leading to the success of all students
- VR will refine Essential Evidence Outcomes during Staff PLC worktime
 - Marzano
 - All departments will refine and use learning goals and scales per subject area and grade level
 - Students can be asked where they are on the scales as they are classroom common knowledge
 - Clear lines of knowledge/understanding benchmarks
 - Keeps communication simple to help teachers and students understand where the students are in terms of progress and mastery

- Capstone Project
 - Completion of a college course with a C or better
 - Approved Workforce Certification
 - Graduation can no longer be accomplished by only passing classes
 - Advising is going to be crucial
 - Students can't just decide to graduate, they will need to be advised to make sure that they complete their Pathways
 - Higher Education Academic Requirements still must be met
 - Student could demonstrate mastery, but will still need to achieve HEAR
 - Remember: Pathway Completion is part of the graduation requirements and therefore will still take a somewhat traditional course load
 - Pathways allow for students to change their minds and get on and off their Pathway course load
 - 5th year students will absolutely be accepted
 - A lot more advising - YouScience will be utilized
 - Only 2021 graduating class will have to adhere to the new graduation requirements
 - Freshmen will start similarly to how 9th grade has always started as we develop and fine tune what it looks like but will begin to be offered exploratory elective courses
 - Sophomores will be more designed and specific to pathways
 - Elective offerings will adjust with student pathway demand
 - Counselors and teachers will discuss prerequisites for each of the degrees/ certifications with students
 - These options help students be more accountable for their own learning
 - Students will be creating Digital Portfolios to track their own learning/ mastery/ goals
 - Pathways classes are all the same currently but each year will add a new level
- **MLO Modification (Construction)**
 - MLO 2 Funding
 - New renderings are visible for all in the front entrance area
 - Top projects were 60% of "wish list" (\$700,500) Blue List - updated Spring 2017
 - Safety & Security
 - ADA Access Road & Concession \$58,500
 - Retaining Wall - Logo \$105,000

- Parking Curb Cut \$25,000
 - HVAC \$200,000
 - Total: \$568,500
 - White List after 60% (\$467,000)
 - Custodial \$60,000
 - Site Circulation (emergency access to the south of us) \$360,000
 - Contingency \$179,000
 - Total \$599,000
- Update 11-8-17
 - Blue List
 - Safety: Cameras Storage/ Lights - \$58,500
 - ADA - \$40,000 (lower)
 - Auditorium upgraded seating (new) - \$300,000
 - Auditorium upgraded lighting - \$175,000
 - HVAC - \$200,000
 - Total: \$773,500
 - Some of the higher priced items were adjusted to accommodate new requests
 - The old seats currently in the Black Box will be moved into the Multipurpose room, & new, upgraded seats will be pushed farther back but same type and will allow for more floor seating
 - We want the best possible lighting we can get within our budget
 - White List
 - Retaining Walls & Logo (on the way up to the football field- rocks, lighting, logo) - \$25,000
 - Site Circulation (adjusted but will still be just as functional as original proposal)- \$150,000
 - Contingency - \$159,000
 - Total: \$394,000
 - Parking Curb Cut is getting cut from the list, will be addressed in the future
 - Unanimous vote to approve differences
 - **Power Dashboard**
 - Power Performance Dashboard
 - Document available in pzinnovators.org
 - 6 indicators were developed with the idea to generate a document that aligned school / district/ zone performance to state assessments
 - Critical Thinking and Problem Solving are grayed out because the measures that we have right now are not truly representative / commensurate of those indicators and do not help us determine if students are truly demonstrating growth

- Zone Innovation Assembly is trying to go directly to the measurement piece to determine how they were going to measure Problem Solving and Critical Thinking and decided that we might need to stop trying to attribute a quantitative data point for these and maybe it needs to be more surrounding teachers' educational methods
- At next ZIA meeting they will start to lay down the process -- what do teachers need to better understand to help students better problem solve/ critical think and what pieces need to be included in every single lesson to help
