



Homeschool Electives

“Electives” are typically courses that fall outside **core academic subjects** (Math, Science, English, Foreign Language, Social Sciences). For many students, elective credits are often made up of additional courses or work-based learning opportunities that reflect the student’s areas of interest and/or is coursework that is directly related to a future career pathway.

You can consider including these types of electives on your high school homeschool transcript:

- Apologetics
- Bible
- Business (accounting, marketing, economics, finance, etc.)
- Communication (speech, journalism, rhetoric, etc.)
- Computer / Technology (computer applications, computer programming or language, web design, keyboarding, graphic design, AutoCAD, architecture, engineering, robotics, Science Olympiad, etc.)
- Fine Arts (dance, music, theatre, orchestra/band/choir, painting, sculpture, photography, film, drawing, etc.)
- Health
- Humanities (philosophy, logic, ethics, humanities, etc.)
- Physical Education
- Personal Finance
- Work-Based Learning / Industry Internships
