Compensation	X	Support for CogAT Administration: In order to determine the names of students who fit a profile for Dyslexia and for whom ALLIES would be a good placement, prospective students in the 3 POWER Zone elementary schools are screened for characteristics of Dyslexia. One of these characteristics is an average to high IQ. An Academic Achievement score is utilized for this purpose based on the scores on the Cognitive Achievement Test or CogAT. Due to the length of time this takes, this test will need to be administered in a group setting by a hired educator or consultant. Amount	\$16,003.90	
Rationale	Power Technical would like to use \$11,003.90 of 3A MLO 2018-2019 funds, and \$5000 of the 3A MLO 2017-18 funds for securing the grounds, traffic flow, main entries, and classrooms at District Schools while training and equipping safety personnel. With these funds we plan to purchase fencing around the perimeter of Power Technical. We will also put up more cameras on the exterior, in the shops, and in the hallways. The school will be using \$16003.90 of the total funds as part of matching funds for a recently awarded "School Safety Disbursement Grant." Detail of these expenditures include: Project 1 (\$4289.90): Purchase additional interior cameras to monitor students inside of the building including the CTE labs. Project 2 (\$1033): Purchase upgraded radios to communicate within the building and James Irwin Safety team. Project 3 (\$10,210): Install perimeter fencing, upgrade the entry door for security, add a security camera and lock for the main entrance, and upgrade classrooms to school-compliant locks.
