
Fall Break

Homeschool Helps: Curriculum, not living up to your hopes?

<u>This Week's Tip</u>: Before jumping ahead and purchasing new curriculum, <u>adapt</u> your existing curriculum.

About this time in the school year, some parents may feel frustrated because the curriculum they spent hours researching is not working out as they had hoped. Before throwing it in the trash and spending more money mid-year, remember that you are in control of your curriculum, it is not in control of you. Think of ways to adapt the curriculum to better meet the needs of your family. Here are some quick tips to adapt curriculum:

- -Assign less problems or length for your child; include problems that show a variety
- -Alter the time of day you are using it
- -Allow your child to respond to answers orally, typed, or using movements

-Use a timer; turn problem solving into a game
